## <u>Spiritual Gifts: Shepherd/Teacher</u> Jason DeWit

## Ephesians 4:11

- 1. The shepherd/teacher desires people to **experience** a full life. (Psalm 23; John 10:10; 1 John 4:20-21)
  - They do this through compassion, empathy, support, nurture and coaching.
- 2. The shepherd/teacher **defends** the community against breakdown. (Ecclesiastes 4:12; Psalm 133:1; 1 Corinthians 1:10; 1 Peter 3:8)
  - They do this through mediation, challenging, encouragement, teaching, modelled behaviour, and practical expressions of care.
- 3. The shepherd/teacher **paces** and **leads** at a rate people can go. (Romans 12:2; 2 Thessalonians 3:5; Acts 2:38)
  - Transformation takes time.
